**Sunday, June 13, 2010**

### **DOWNTOWN HISTORICAL DISTRICT TOUR**

**Bus departs Hotel at 11:00 am**

We will depart the Resort for a short bus ride to the downtown historical district known as El Presidio. The **El Presidio Inn** is a Victorian style Bed & Breakfast located in the downtown El Presidio area. Originally erected in 1876, the Inn reigned as the Julius Knuttschmitt House on Main Street, the center of high society (also known as Snob Hill) in this dusty frontier village. Today, Patty Toci is the owner. From its purchase in 1970, it took 17 years to restore this beautiful home. Some of you may recall having a lovely lunch here at the 2001 Conference. Lunch will be served in the magnificent shaded courtyard, followed by a presentation by **Dr. Carrol McLaughlin**, a Canadian born harpist.

Dr. McLaughlin enjoys combining her harp music with inspirational speaking and fully engages her audience. She has toured extensively as a soloist throughout Europe, Asia, and the Americas. She holds degrees of M.M. from the Julliard School and Doctor of Musical Arts from the University of Arizona, where she was Teaching Assistant to Susann McDonald. She also studied extensively in England with Russian harpist Maria Korchinska.

Dr. McLaughlin became head of the harp department at the University of Arizona in 1982, and in 1994 was the recipient of the UA Five Star Faculty Teaching Award for Excellence. She has performed highly successful debut recitals in Carnegie Hall, New York and Wigmore Hall, London and has performed extensively as concerto soloist with orchestras throughout the US, Japan, Russia, Canada and South America. Carrol was represented in the US for thirteen years by Columbia Artists Management, and is on the Board of Directors of the World Harp Congress. She is the Director of Harp Fusion, the UA Harp Ensemble who have performed in Japan, Russia, Switzerland, Puerto Rico, Mexico and the Czech Republic.

### **SABINO CANYON & TOHONO CHUL PARK TOUR**

**Bus departs Hotel at 9:00 am**

This day will combine the artistry of nature and man for a beautiful desert experience. A short bus ride will take us to **Sabino Canyon**, nestled in the foothills of the Santa Catalina Mountains. This canyon offers views of sparkling mountain streams and majestic mountains and we will be taking a breathtaking outdoor covered tram ride through the canyon. This is an experience not to be missed by nature lovers or anyone who enjoys the great outdoors. Don't forget your camera!

Then it is on to **Tohono Chul Park**. Recently chosen as one of the ten great botanical gardens in the world, this 49-acre Tucson oasis contains nature trails, art exhibits, demonstration gardens, museum shops and a green room. A handsome Spanish-Colonial home, the West House, with its plant filled courtyard and welcoming patio is home to the **Tohono Chul Park Tea Room**, where we will enjoy a relaxing, tasty lunch.

Following lunch, a short bus ride will take us to **DeGrazia's Gallery in the Sun**. This 10-acre foothills site is a Tucson landmark that welcomes thousands of visitors each year. Designed by Ted Grazia himself to house his works, this gallery features adobe construction and beautiful decorative features as well as DeGrazia's art. The son of Italian immigrants, Ettore DeGrazia was born in 1909 in the Morenci mining camp of territorial Arizona. His early childhood experiences in the ethnically diverse community evolved into a lifelong appreciation of native cultures in the Sonoran Desert and a passion to create art depicting their lives and lore. DeGrazia's paintings, ceramics and other artwork steadily attracted media attention including the NBC news-reel "Watch the World" and a profile in the 1953 National Geographic article "From Tucson to Tombstone". His fame flourished when UNICEF chose his 1957 oil painting "Los Ninos" for a 1960 holiday card that sold millions worldwide. Mr. DeGrazia established the DeGrazia Foundation prior to his death in 1982 to ensure permanent preservation of his art and architecture for future generations.
